#### **Decalogue Litany of Self-Examination and Repentance**

Using the Ten Commandments as our prayer, let us kneel before God, who gave us the Law as our guide, and his only Son as our Redeemer from sin.

I. I am the Lord your God who brought you out of bondage.

You shall have no other gods but me.

Dear Lord, we have let our daily problems and concerns overshadow Your importance in our lives. We have failed to live into the freedom that living in relation with you brings.

Calm our troubled minds so we can focus on our relationship with You.

II. You shall not make for yourself any idol.

Dear Lord, we have made our material lives our priority, forgetting our relationship with You, the Source of all things.

Remind us that our greatest gifts come from You. Help us to turn around.

III. You shall not invoke with malice the Name of the Lord your God.

Dear Lord, our words and actions have not reflected our desire to follow You.

Help us to keep You in our hearts to guide us through our daily lives.

IV. Remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy.

On the seventh day of creation, you rested and reflected. We have failed to follow your example of taking rest and pleasure in the goodness of creation.

Heal us from our busyness, and restore us to unity with you and with one another.

V. Honor your father and your mother.

We have dishonored those who nurtured us in the past and who continue to nurture us now, by failing to value and give thanks for the sacrifices they made for us.

Pardon our neglect, and restore us to unity with you and with one another.

VI. You shall not commit murder.

We have spoken and tolerated words that diminish others, giving solace to harmful sentiments. Deliver us from all violence of thought, speech or deed, and restore us to unity with you and with one another.

VII. You shall not commit adultery.

We have failed to nurture our relationships by violating our vows by selfishly thinking of ourselves alone.

Call us to your standard of fidelity and loving-kindness, and restore us to unity with you and with one another.

VIII. You shall not steal.

We have taken what does not belong to us, through dishonesty as well as the misuse of our wealth and power.

Give us a new reverence for the earth and for our neighbor, and restore us to unity with you and with one another.

IX. You shall not be a false witness.

We have lied to ourselves and to others, distorting the truth to serve our own agenda.


Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, and restore us to unity with you and with one another.

X. You shall not covet anything that belongs to your neighbor.

We have lusted after things that belong to other people, and we have measured our worth by their lives. Help us accept your grace as sufficient for us, and restore us to unity with you and with one another.

Let us now pray for our own needs, and those of others; offering thanks to God for our blessings and
recalling those who are in any need or trouble. Please offer your thanksgivings and intercessions at this
time
Let us also pray for those who have died, including any whom we name at this time

#### The First Lesson 1 Samuel 16:1-13

The Lord said to Samuel, "How long will you grieve over Saul? I have rejected him from being king over Israel. Fill your horn with oil and set out; I will send you to Jesse the Bethlehemite, for I have provided for myself a king among his sons." Samuel said, "How can I go? If Saul hears of it, he will kill me." And the Lord said, "Take a heifer with you, and say, 'I have come to sacrifice to the Lord.' Invite Jesse to the sacrifice, and I will show you what you shall do; and you shall anoint for me the one whom I name to you." Samuel did what the Lord commanded, and came to Bethlehem. The elders of the city came to meet him trembling, and said, "Do you come peaceably?" He said, "Peaceably; I have come to sacrifice to the Lord; sanctify yourselves and come with me to the sacrifice." And he sanctified Jesse and his sons and invited them to the sacrifice.

When they came, he looked on Eliab and thought, "Surely the Lord's anointed is now before the Lord." But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him; for the Lord does not see as mortals see; they look on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart." Then Jesse called Abinadab, and made him pass before Samuel. He said, "Neither has the Lord chosen this one." Then Jesse made Shammah pass by. And he said, "Neither has the Lord chosen this one." Jesse made seven of his sons pass before Samuel, and Samuel said to Jesse, "The Lord has not chosen any of these." Samuel said to Jesse, "Are all your sons here?" And he said, "There remains yet the youngest, but he is keeping the sheep." And Samuel said to Jesse, "Send and bring him; for we will not sit down until he comes here." He sent and brought him in. Now he was ruddy, and had beautiful eyes, and was handsome. The Lord said, "Rise and anoint him; for this is the one." Then Samuel took the horn of oil, and anointed him in the presence of his brothers; and the spirit of the Lord came mightily upon David from that day forward. Samuel then set out and went to Ramah.

Once you were darkness, but now in the Lord you are light. Live as children of light—for the fruit of the light is found in all that is good and right and true. Try to find out what is pleasing to the Lord. Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them. For it is shameful even to mention what such people do secretly; but everything exposed by the light becomes visible, for everything that becomes visible is light. Therefore it says,


"Sleeper, awake! Rise from the dead, and Christ will shine on you."

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

As he walked along, he saw a man blind from birth. His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" Jesus answered, "Neither this man nor his parents sinned; he was born blind so that God's works might be revealed in him. We must work the works of him who sent me while it is day; night is coming when no one can work. As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world." When he had said this, he spat on the ground and made mud with the saliva and spread the mud on the man's eyes, saying to him, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam" (which means Sent). Then he went and washed and came back able to see. The neighbors and those who had seen him before as a beggar began to ask, "Is this not the man who used to sit and beg?" Some were saying, "It is he." Others were saying, "No, but it is someone like him." He kept saying, "I am the man." But they kept asking him, "Then how were your eyes opened?" He answered, "The man called Jesus made mud, spread it on my eyes, and said to me, 'Go to Siloam and wash.' Then I went and washed and received my sight." They said to him, "Where is he?" He said, "I do not know."

They brought to the Pharisees the man who had formerly been blind. Now it was a sabbath day when Jesus made the mud and opened his eyes. Then the Pharisees also began to ask him how he had received his sight. He said to them, "He put mud on my eyes. Then I washed, and now I see." Some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, for he does not observe the sabbath." But others said, "How can

a man who is a sinner perform such signs?" And they were divided. So they said again to the blind man, "What do you say about him? It was your eyes he opened." He said, "He is a prophet."

So for the second time they called the man who had been blind, and they said to him, "Give glory to God! We know that this man is a sinner." He answered, "I do not know whether he is a sinner. One thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see." They said to him, "What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?" He answered them, "I have told you already, and you would not listen. Why do you want to hear it again? Do you also want to become his disciples?" They answered him, "You were born entirely in sins, and are you trying to teach us?" And they drove him out.

Jesus heard that they had driven him out, and when he found him, he said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" He answered, "And who is he, sir? Tell me, so that I may believe in him." Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, and the one speaking with you is he." He said, "Lord, I believe." And he worshiped him. After the Gospel, the Deacon says

#### Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.


The Celebrant calls upon the Holy Spirit to bless the gifts and people.

All are welcome to receive Holy Communion, including visitors and small children. Ushers will direct you to the altar rail or to a communion station in the center aisle. Gluten-free hosts are available on request at the front altar at 8 a.m. and at the small altar on the north side of the church at 10 a.m., so please approach those locations for that option. You may stand or kneel (if at the altar rail) to receive the bread in open hands and either guide the chalice to your lips by adding your hand to the base or dip the bread slightly. Those not wishing to receive Communion are invited to receive a blessing: Simply cross your arms over your chest to indicate your preference.

#### **Postcommunion Prayer** Please stand or kneel.

Eternal God, heavenly Father, you have graciously accepted us as living members of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ, and you have fed us with spiritual food in the Sacrament of his Body and Blood. Send us now into the world in peace, and grant us strength and courage to love and serve you with gladness and singleness of heart; through Christ our Lord. Amen.
